Scholarship awards

Awards typically range from \$500 to \$2,200 and are applicable to course fees. CCE scholarships are one-time awards, intended to help students take the next step in pursuing their educational goals. Applicants will be notified of the Scholarship Committee's decision within three weeks of the application deadline.

Eligibility requirements

- US citizen, permanent resident, or eligible noncitizen
- Reside in Minnesota
- CCE connection—enrolled in CCE noncredit courses
- Gap in education of two years or more
- Financial need
- Good standing at the University of Minnesota
- Academic transcripts submitted

Review criteria

Academic record, strength of personal statement, extra-curricular activities or community involvement, financial need, and special circumstances.

Expectations of recipients

- Remain in good standing with continued progress toward educational, career, or life goals.
- Submit a letter thanking scholarship donors and consider sharing your story to promote the College of Continuing Education and its scholarship programs.
